

EdCity Welcomes Policy Address's Initiative for Digital Education Empowering Teachers, Enhancing Student Digital Literacy, and Ushering in a New Era of Digital Transformation

Hong Kong, 17 September 2025 — The Hong Kong Education City (EdCity) warmly welcomes that latest Policy Address, which outlines a series of strategic initiatives to accelerate digital education in Hong Kong. Among the key initiatives is the Education Bureau's earmarking of HK\$2 billion from Quality Education Fund to support the digital education development of primary and secondary schools, alongside the unveiling of a comprehensive Digital Education Blueprint slated for next year. In full alignment with the government's strategic direction, EdCity stands ready to serve as a 'super-connector' and 'super-facilitator', championing the advancement of Hong Kong's digital education by providing interactive learning platforms for teachers, students and parents, while harnessing corporate partnership to drive digital education. In close collaboration with the education sector, EdCity is poised to usher in a new era of digital learning.

The 'Policy Address' places artificial intelligence (AI) at the heart of educational reform, committing substantial resources to enhance digital literacy and establish a clear roadmap for systemic change. Last year, EdCity successfully delivered on the goals outlined in the previous 'Policy Address' by launching a series of real-time online lessons and self-paced courses in AI and computational thinking, which drew enthusiastic participation from teachers and students alike. A dedicated webpage featuring expert lecture videos was also introduced. Currently, EdCity is developing a one-stop digital education resource platform, curating high-quality e-teaching tools from both local and global sources. This platform aims to empower educators to spark student curiosity, foster self-directed and personalised learning.

EdCity has been appointed by the Quality Education Fund to lead the implementation of the HK\$500 million e-Learning Ancillary Facilities Programme (eLAFP), which provides comprehensive assistance to schools and service providers across Hong Kong. The scheme funds 22 e-learning projects tailored to local educational needs, encompassing innovative technologies such as AI and big data. This initiative aims to enhance teaching and learning across a wide range of subjects and disciplines. The first three projects were successfully launched in June and are now available for school adoption. EdCity remains committed to helping more schools adopt these digital solutions and drive meaningful transformation in education.

To sustain this momentum, EdCity will expand its professional training programmes for educators in partnership with leading innovation and technology enterprises. These initiatives will include hands-on workshops, specialised training programmes, and exhibitions showcasing innovative educational technologies. Through structured and systematic training, EdCity seeks to empower teachers to seamlessly integrate AI and digital tools into their classrooms—enhancing pedagogical effectiveness and nurturing a generation of digitally fluent, future-ready talent. EdCity is fully committed to supporting the Government’s forthcoming Digital Education Blueprint for primary and secondary schools, laying a solid foundation for the future of digital learning.

Looking ahead, EdCity will continue to serve as a ‘super connector,’ actively linking stakeholders across government, industry, academia, research, and investment to build a robust digital education ecosystem. This collaborative effort will foster deeper integration between education and technology, cultivate a new generation of globally minded, socially responsible talent, and support Hong Kong’s ambition to become an international hub for innovation and educational excellence—echoing the national strategy of “Revitalising the Nation through Science and Education.”
